

YOUR GUIDE TO CAMPGROUND ETIQUETTE (CONTINUED)



BE MINDFUL OF YOUR NOISE LEVEL

Enjoy music at your site at a decent volume so other campers don't have to hear it all day.

Have fun, but also be aware that many people go camping to enjoy peace and quiet.



MIND YOUR CAMPFIRE

Check to be sure that campfires are currently allowed in the campground.

Keep campfire flame at a decent size.

Never leave a campfire unattended and be sure to fully extinguish campfire before leaving or going to sleep.



KEEP THE BATH HOUSE & OTHER FACILITIES CLEAN

We work hard to keep all campground facilities clean, but many campers use them throughout the day. Do your part to keep these areas clean when using them by picking up after yourself and reporting any spills or broken equipment immediately.

If you find the bath house or any facility dirty, let the office know right away and we will take care of it.

OBSERVE QUIET TIMES



We have posted quiet times that we enforce so that all campers can enjoy themselves and get rest when needed.

Keep noise level of talking, children and pets low and music off during these times.

KEEP A TIDY CAMPSITE



Be sure all garbage and food gets cleaned up to avoid attracting wildlife.

Clean up your site at the end of the night, placing outdoor supplies, bins, toys, etc. under or close to your RV or in your car. This allows everyone to enjoy a nice clean campground in the morning as well as protecting your things in case it gets windy or rainy in the middle of the night.

FOLLOW ALL CAMPGROUND RULES



Besides the general campground etiquette tips listed here, be aware that campgrounds may have additional specific rules to ensure that everyone enjoys their time and stays safe. Be aware of what these rules are and observe them closely.



GO THE SPEED LIMIT

The speed limit is there to ensure the safety of all campers. Observe the speed limit and be aware of children running, biking and playing near the road.

BE A RESPONSIBLE PET OWNER

Keep your dog leashed and in your control at all times.

Keep dogs quiet during quiet time. Excessive barking is unacceptable at any time of day.

Pick up after your dog.

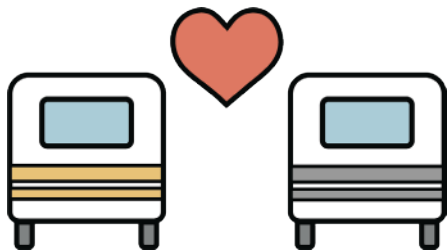


OBSERVE CHECK IN/ OUT TIMES

If arriving later in the evening, come at a decent time so as not to disturb fellow campers.

Be aware that some campgrounds do not allow check-ins after a certain time.



RESPECT YOUR NEIGHBORS

Do not walk through other campsites. This is a big campground no-no!

Keep all your vehicles, chairs, bikes, toys, etc. on your site, even if the site next to you appears to be empty.
